Post Surgery Check List

Your pet has undergone a procedure today using anesthesia. This may cause drowsiness, nausea, and loss of appetite.

1. **Go slow with food and water this evening.** Your pet may not want anything. Offer a small amount of water first. If your pet keeps it down, then offer a small amount of **soft or canned food**. If your pet is still not interested in food within 24 hours after the surgery, please call us.
2. **Limit strenous exercise** for 48 hours. Your pet may still be feeling the effects of anesthesia.
3. Because your pet had an endotracheal tube placed in his/her throat, **you may notice some coughing**. This should be mild and only last for a few days.
4. If your pet has been prescribed antibiotics, please give all medications as directed until gone. For severe inflammation, you may be asked to do "pulse therapy", antibiotics given the first three days of every month to reduce gingivitis and prolong the time needed for the next dental prophylaxis.
